Meeting called to order: 6:32 p.m. by Whit, standing in for Daryl.

The meeting began with a presentation by Evan Glass, the newly elected County Council President. He indicated that his priorities for the coming year include streamlining the building permitting process and fee and reporting requirements, addressing the climate crisis by requiring buildings owned by the County to be operated in a more ecology-friendly manner, and implementing the Safe Streets Act. He noted that last year 541 people had been hit by vehicles in the County, and 19 of those people had died. He said that one of the policies that they are looking it is banning right turn on red lights in certain urban areas. He asked for questions and to hear about our concerns.

The items that were raised in discussion included the Vision Zero program to try to eliminate pedestrian deaths, the scarcity of Ride-On buses in our area and the urgent need for sidewalks (particularly along Route 108), support for the County program eliminating bus fares for individuals under the age of 18, the need for more speed cameras on Route 108, opposition to the proposal that would permit homeowners to rent out facilities such as swimming pools provided they are registered with the County, the need to encourage alternative energy sources, and the difficulties with the Planning Board.

The minutes of the February 13, 2023 meeting were approved. Marie Slater delivered the report of the Traffic Committee, consistent with the email she sent before the meeting (attached). The Treasurers Report was delivered and accepted (also attached). There was a discussion about a proposal by Camp Rippling Brook to build camp facilities on New Hampshire Avenue just above the power lines (it was agreed that Doug would contact the organization sponsoring the application and a neighborhood opponent to schedule presentations to the SSCA). Whit commented that the amount of crime in the County is concerning.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
